EDDIE "The Chief" CLEARWATER

Eddie Clearwater puts on a flamboyant show the New Yorker described as, "A Chicago Blues man with a mean Chuck Berry streak. Not to be missed!" His high energy performance of good natured party music is finessed with original, deep, melancholy blues. A long time recording artist, a WC Handy Award winner, this colorful entertainer is a tribute described by Ted Drwodoski of Pulse! as "finger busting guitar licks" and "he reignites the fires of knife-edged blues from Chicago's West Side." The Chicago Tribune claimed him "Chicago's premiere blues showman." A half century later, with his 2003 CD release of 'Rock n Roll City', Eddie "The Chief" Clearwater is still making history!
